Abstract	The purpose of this study was to explore whether childhood experiences and wellbeing affect the learning process in adulthood. Participants were asked to complete a General Well-Being Scale survey along with an interview in an attempt to determine if there was a connection between childhood experiences and overall achievement in adult learning opportunities. Case studies were also completed to provide a more detailed account of the experiences that have led each participant to make the decisions they have about pursuing future learning opportunities. Evidence obtained in this study showed that childhood experiences and wellbeing do affect the learning process in adulthood. However, in light of this evidence, most participants were not aware of the affect that past experiences had on their overall success pursuing adult learning opportunities. Participants in this study found themselves repeating the same behaviors which in turn, produced the same, undesired result(s). Regular self-reflection along with an awareness of the basic tenets of emotional intelligence, can aid adult learners in developing behaviors to not only achieve a more successful learning transfer, but to also enjoy the learning process as well.
